This Indenture made and entered into this 26th day of April one thousand eight hundred and twenty four between Joseph B. Whithead and Stephen Elsworth of the first part and Brooks K. Fitzgerald of the second part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia Witness that whereas the said Joseph B. Whithead is jointly and jointly to the said Stephen Elsworth full and just sum of Six hundred dollars due by bond bearing date with these presents and on the 1st day of January 1834 the sum of One hundred dollars due by bond bearing date January 1st 1834 fifty dollars of which is payable on or before the first day of June 1834 and fifty dollars the balance thereof payable before the 25th day of December 1834. the said Joseph B. Whithead being willing and desirous to secure the payment of the aforesaid sum of money do by these presents to sell unto Brooks K. Fitzgerald the receipt whereof is hereof acknowledged the following property to wit: One negro woman named Aggy and her son ^{Sam} Charles, Patty, Jane, Sini and Mary and their families and his stock of hogs of every kind and description and their increase to the said Brooks K. Fitzgerald his heirs and administrators also his Crop of Cotton under Cultivation the present year to hold the aforesaid property unto the said Brooks K. Fitzgerald his heirs and administrators for the only use and behoof of the said Stephen Elsworth his heirs Executors and assigns. This Indenture further Witnesseth that the said Brooks K. Fitzgerald will for the said Joseph B. Whithead to keep possession of the said property until default be made in the payment of the before mentioned sum of money or otherwise then and in that case the said Brooks K. Fitzgerald or his legal representation will proceed to sell the aforesaid property as he may think fit or will satisfy the aforesaid bonds and interest and the costs attending the sale of the same. He shall advertise the day at three or more public places before the day of sale and out of the proceeds of said sale the said Brooks K. Fitzgerald shall pay over to the said Stephen Elsworth his heirs Executors and assigns the aforesaid Bonds and interest and the balance of any pay over to Joseph B.
