This Indenture made and entered into this 27th day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty three between James Pope of the first part and Augustus Pope of the second part both of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia Witnesses that for and in Consideration of the Sum of two hundred and thirty dollars paid by the said Augustus Pope before the signing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said James Pope hath granted conveyed sold confirmed and confirmed unto Augustus Pope his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract of land by estimation of sixty four acres be the same more or less being my old plantation known as formerly lived and bounded as follows beginning at a short gum stump standing in the 1st of gum thorns near a north line along said Holt's line to a post oak standing in the edge of the pasture in said Holt's line thence near a small wet Come to the beginning To have and to hold the said tract of land with the tenements hereunto and every of his appurtenances and behoof unto the said Augustus Pope his heirs and assigns forever to and for the only proper use and behoof of him the said Augustus Pope his heirs and assigns forever and the said James Pope doth give hereafter warrant and defend the title of the same against himself and all persons who shall claim or demanding In Witness whereof the said James Pope hath hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this day and date within written.
