This Indenture made and entered into this 27th day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and Thirty three between James Pope of the first part and Auguston Pope of the second part both of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia witnesseth that for and in Consideration of the sum of four hundred Dollars in hand paid by the said Auguston Pope before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged to be the Said James Pope hath granted bargained sold and delivered unto the said Auguston Pope his heirs and assigns forever on certain tract of land by estimation of forty four acres to be the same more or less being my old plantation wherons I formerly lived and bounded as follows beginning at a stout gun Stump standing in the road branch in Auguston Pope's line thence down the run of said branch to S. Holt's line a corner gun stone near a North fence along said Holt's line to a post oak standing on the edge of the pasture in said Holt's line thence near a small West Corner to the beginning To have and to hold the said tract of land with the tenements hereditaments and wayes of his appurtenances thereon unto the said Auguston Pope his heirs and assigns forever to and for the only purpose and intent hereof to be the said Auguston Pope his heirs and assigns forever and the said James Pope will for ever after warrant and defend the title of the same against himself and all persons whoe ever claiming or demanding In witness whereof the said James Pope has hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this day and date written.
