Know all men by these presents that I Thomas Bevan of the State of Virginia and Sheriff for the County of and in Consideration of the sum of one dollar to me in hand paid by George T. Bevan of the said State and Surry County before the sealing and delivering acknowledge have bargained sold granted sold granted and confirmed to the said George T. Bevan all the Crop of Corn and the balance of what I make this present year by paying the hire of two hands then to work in the Crop now making also one new Cart and wheels but lately made one new single gig and harness and my interest in the horse I use if any and two glassen beds and furniture I lately purchased, a two barrel Still and wood and all the household and kitchen furniture not heretofore made over to John Riney and the board of the board I have endorsed to George T. Bevan except what I have endorsed to John Riney to secure a debt due him and I further endorse all my outstanding debts to George T. Bevan to Collect and pay a debt due to Henry Lewis's Estate and the stock of hogs as far as I am interested provided the said George T. Bevan pay the debts named above and others, I have gave him a list of to the only proper use to be used to him the said G. T. B. his Executor administration and assigns for the said Thomas Bevan for myself my heirs Executors administration the said property and account to the said George T. Bevan his heirs Executors and assigns I the said Thomas Bevan my heirs or assigns and every other person or persons whatsoever shall and well warrant and defend by these presents provided the said parties to these presents that if I the said Thomas Bevan or my heirs Executors do and shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid to the said George T. Bevan or his heirs or assigns the just and full sum of a Bond given by Thomas Bevan to George T. Bevan on or before the first day of January 1835 for the Redemption of these aforesaid bargained premises then these presents and every clause and Condition shall cease and be void otherwise to remain in full force and effect.
