This Indenture made this 13th of June in the year Eighteen hundred and thirty four between George G. Gentry of Southampton of the first part Litchell R Edwards of the second part and Johnell Gentry of the third part Witnesseth that the said George G. Gentry being indebted to the said Johnell Gentry for an open account of five hundred dollars due and owing from the said George G. Gentry to the said Johnell Gentry and being anxious to have the payment of the same to the said Johnell Gentry and have him free of all for and in consideration of the premises as well as for the further consideration of one dollar delivery of three presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained sold and bequeathed the following property To wit four beds and furniture, one deer Tong, one large Walnut Table one small do one pine do one and a half dozen Windsor chairs, one and a half dozen Flag do one steel, iron &c five ploughs, six, one and a half dozen One short gun, four narrow axes, three broad do 2 1/2 iron wedges 1 four two spoke of iron One Carry leg, wheels & Chain 3 small pots 1 large do 1 spade and ditch iron 1 hoghead iron 2 1/2 and iron shovel and tongs 1 apple mill 2 pipes 30 Barrels 10 horseheads 1 Grinding Stone Books five hundred pounds, four six Barrels Corn all my interest for two years remaining Rent of a Saw mill from James Rochelle Crop of Corn 30 bushels and feed and Cotton 2 Crop Cut Saws all my interest in my father's Estate either in possession or reversion or remainder To have and to hold the aforesaid granted property to him the said L R Edwards his heirs Executors administrators against the claim of him the said Johnell Gentry his heirs Executors or assigns or all and every person or persons claiming by or through him upon trust nevertheless that the said Litchell R Edwards shall whenever he shall be called on and required by the said Johnell Gentry or giving thirty days public notice of the time and place of sale proceed to sell the aforesaid granted property at public sale for cash and after paying to the said Johnell Gentry the debt aforesaid with the interest accruing thereon and the costs of this indenture pay over the balance of any to the said G. G. Gentry his heirs or assigns and the said L. R. Edwards covenants to and with the parties hereto faithfully to execute the trust hereby made him.
