Witnesseth that the said Gray being indebted to the said John Bishop in the sum of two hundred and sixteen dollars by bond bearing date the 2nd of July 1834. and also in another account for to wit this year and being anxious to secure the said Hart from any loss on the aforesaid debts as also on account of a Security slip in which the said Hart stands bound for the said Gray to pay to said John Bishop Executor of William Allen dec'd for and in consideration of the premises as well as for the further sum of One dollar to him in hand paid by the said Bishop at or before the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged which granted bargained sold aliened released and confirmed unto the said Bishop the following property to wit all the said Gray's Books personal or otherwise which he the said Gray had now in his Office in Southampton also one several hundred and thirty two guns also five hundred dollars in bonds and accounts now due and owing to said Gray to have and to hold the aforesaid granted property to the use and behoof of him the said
