Between Drury Waller adm^r with the Will annexed of James Miller d. of the one part and
Jesse S. Barham of the other part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia
Witnesseth that the said Drury Waller adm^r with the Will annexed of James Miller d. of the one part and in consideration of the sum of Six hundred and thirty dollars to him in hand paid by the said Jesse S. Barham at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge, have granted bargained and sold and confirmed unto him the said Jesse S. Barham his heirs and assigns forever one certain parcel or tract of land, Situate lying and being in the aforesaid County and bounded as follows Beginning at a forked red Oak a corner of Nathaniel Simmons thence North twenty degrees East forty poles, then S 70. East sixty poles then S 87. East twenty poles then at 210. East 6 poles to a red oak a corner of Edwin Waller then S 70. East twenty poles to a large gum in the said line, then S 50. East forty two poles to a hickory a corner of Abner Foster then S 30. West thirty poles to a black jack a corner of said Foster's land then S 70. East hundred and sixteen poles to a black gum in the south prong of the Buckhorn branch up the various courses of said branch two hundred and forty one poles to a dead oak corner of said Foster, Williams and Turner thence at 160. West seventy poles to a maple corner of Turner's line thence at 8. West thirty eight poles to a post in Drury Waller's line along said Waller's line to the beginning containing two hundred and forty acres be the more or less. To have and to hold the said two hundred and forty acres of land unto the said Jesse S. Barham and his heirs forever. To the only proper use and behoof of the said Jesse S. Barham his heirs and assigns and the said Drury Waller adm^r with the Will annexed of James Miller d. of the one part and agreed unto the said Jesse S. Barham his heirs and assigns that the said Drury Waller adm^r his heirs and assigns shall forever defend the title of the aforesaid land and promised unto him the said Jesse S. Barham his heirs and assigns forever against the lawful claim or claims of any person or persons whatsoever. I have herewith set my hand and affixed my seal the day and date above written.
