This Indenture made this seventh day of July One Thousand Eight hundred and thirty five between Drury Waller admr. with the Will annexed of James Waller dec'd of the one part and Jepo S. Barham of the other part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia Witnesseth that the said Drury Waller admr. with the Will annexed of James Waller dec'd doth for and in consideration of the sum of Six hundred and three dollars to him in paid by the said Jepo S. Barham at and before the sealing and delivery of these present the receipt whereof Jepo hereby acknowledge hath granted bargained and sold also and confirmed unto him the said Jepo S. Barham his heirs and assigns forever one certain piece or tract of land situated lying and lying in the aforesaid County and bounded Beginning at a forked red Oak a corner of Nathaniel Simmonds thence North Seventy degrees forty poles, then S 70° E East Sixty poles then S 87° E East twenty poles then S 10° E East poles to a red oak a corner of Elwin Waller then S 70° East Twenty poles to a large gum in the said line, then S 50° E East forty two poles to a hickory a corner of Arthur Foster dec'd S 34° E North Sixty poles to a black jack a corner of said Foster's land then S 70° E East hundred and sixteen poles to a black gum in the south prong of the Buckhorn Branch up the various courses of said branch two hundred and forty one poles to a dead tree of said Foster, Williams and Turner slaves etc. W. D. West Seventy poles to a mouth in Turner's line thence E. 8. D. West ninety eight poles to a post in Drury Waller's line along said Waller's line to the beginning containing two hundred and six rods to be the more or less. To have and to hold the said two hundred and forty one acres of land with and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging to the said Jepo S. Barham and his heirs forever. To the only proper use and behoef of the said Jepo S. Barham his heirs and assigns and the said Drury Waller admr. with the Will annexed of James Waller dec'd doth covenant and agree with the said Jepo S. Barham his heirs and assigns to he the said Drury Waller admr. his heirs and assigns shall forever defend the title of the aforesaid land and premises unto him the said Jepo S. Barham his heirs and assigns forever against the lawful claim or claims of any person or persons whatsoever I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the day and date above written signed, sealed and delivered in presence of us
