This Indenture made this 23rd day of February 1834 Between Joseph H. Parker and John M. Tiller Commissioners appointed under a decree of the County Court of Southampton of the one part and Solomon D. Parker of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Joseph H. Parker and John M. Tiller Commissioners in consideration of the sum of Eight hundred and lawful money of the Commonwealth to them in hand paid by the said Solomon D. Parker at witness the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold and by these presents do and each of them doth bargain and sell unto the said Solomon D. Parker his heirs and assigns a Certain tract or parcel of land situate in the County of Southampton containing more or less and a half acres and bounded as follows Beginning at Red oak at Bull's head thence along a line of marked trees to a pine a corner in the line of the Estate of Richard S. Clements thence along said Clements' line to Bull's head thence along a line of marked trees or Bull's old road to the beginning together with all and singular the appurtenances unto the said tract or parcel of land or in any wise appertaining or belonging To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with all and singular the appurtenances unto the said Solomon D. Parker his heirs and assigns forever and for the only proper use and behoof of him the said Solomon D. Parker his heirs and assigns. And the said Joseph H. Parker and John M. Tiller Commissioners for themselves and the said tract or parcel of land with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said Solomon D. Parker his heirs and assigns free from the claims or claims of them the said Joseph H. Parker and John M. Tiller Commissioners or either of them their or either of their heirs and of all and every person or persons whatsoever shall will and do warrant and forever defend by these presents.
