Maplebury and Moore. This Indenture made and entered into this 21st day of December Eighteen hundred and twenty nine. Between James Maplebury and Eliza his wife of the one part and John Moore of the other part. Witnesseth that the said James Maplebury and Eliza his wife for and in Consideration of two hundred and Eighty dollars Current money lawfully bargained and sold and by these presents do and each of them doth bargain and sell unto the said John Moore his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land containing by estimation fifty acres and of them sixteen chs of an acre be the same more or less and bounded as follows. Beginning at a small pine marked for a man born in 1801. Then along said line to a Red oak near the road and thence to the Center of the said land running from Jerusalem to S. P. and thence up said road to a Hickory made a corner thence at 33rd E 150 poles to the first station and the corner in and around and do and remain in yearly and other rents fees and profits and every part and parcel thereof.
