Third Indenture made and entered into this 26<sup>th</sup> day of July 1834 between Andrew Stevenson  
Holland of the first part, Septe Parker of the second part and Hining J. Smith of the  
third part all of the State of Virginia and County of Southampton. Whereas the said  
Andrew Stevenson Holland is indebted to the said H. J. Smith in the sum of four hundred fifty  
six dollars and thirty cents due by bond bearing date with these presents and whereas  
the said Andrew Stevenson Holland is willing and desires the payment of the said sum  
of money to the said H. J. Smith be made on this Indenture witness wherefore it is  
agreed and in Consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said  
Septe Parker he the said Andrew Stevenson Holland hath given granted bargained and  
sold unto him the said Septe Parker the following property to wit my stock of  
goods consisting of dry goods, Crockery, hardware, and groceries also all of my house-  
hold and Kitchen furniture and negro woman Rachel and also my slave and black  
smith apn now on my books to him and his heirs forever upon trust nevertheless  
that the said Andrew Stevenson Holland is to retain possession of said property until required by  
the said H. J. Smith to sell whereupon the said Septe Parker shall after advertising the  
time and place of said sale sell such of the said property as is his now valued at full  
price and sufficient to pay the said debt and interest to the said H. J. Smith  
and all expenses attending the sale. In witness whereof the several parties hereunto set their
