Hapburg and Eliza his wife or either of them their or either of them heirs and of all and every person what manner shall well intend do warrant and forever defend to those presents. In Witness whereof the said James M. Hapburg and Eliza his wife have hereunto set their hands and seals this day and year before written.

Personally appeared before us William A. Sparks and Jeremiah Cobb Magistrates of the aforesaid County Eliza Hapburg the wife of the within named James M. Hapburg parties to the within Bond of conveyance who acknowledged that she signed the said Bond freely and voluntarily and she wishes not to retract the same. And also wishes us to certify the same for record in the said County of Southampton. Given under our hands and seals this 21st day of September 1833.

Hapburg and together with the Certificate thereto annexed of the free examination and relinquishment of Bond of Eliza Hapburg wife of the said James M. Hapburg parties thereto admitted to record. And at a Court held for the County aforesaid the 18th day of August 1834 The said Indenture and Certificate were entered upon the proceedings of the day.

This Indenture made and entered into this 26th day of July 1834 between Stevenson Holland of the first part, Jesse Parker of the second part and Henry J. Smith of the third part all of the State of Virginia and County of Southampton. Whereas the said Stevenson Holland is indebted to the said H. J. Smith in the sum of four hundred fifty six dollars and thirty Cents due by bond bearing date with these presents and whereas the said Stevenson Holland is willing and desirous the payment of the said sum of money to the said H. J. Smith be secured. Now this Indenture Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of One dollar to him in hand paid by the said Jesse Parker he the said Stevenson Holland hath given granted bargained and sold unto him the said Jesse Parker the following property to wit my stock of goods consisting of dry goods, crockery, hardware, and groceries also all of my household and kitchen furniture and negro women Rachel and also my store and Trade Smith and now on my books to him and his heirs forever. Upon trust nevertheless that the said Stevenson Holland is to retain possession of said property until required by the said H. J. Smith to sell whereupon the said Jesse Parker shall after advertising the time and place of said sale sell such of the said property as is his own conveyed as shall be necessary and sufficient to pay the said debt and interest to the said H. J. Smith and all expenses attending the sale. In Witness whereof the several parties hereto set their hands and seals this day and date first above written.
