Dwany Sheriff To Brale. This Indenture made and entered into this 21st day of July 1834. Between Benjamin Dwany Sheriff of the County of Southampton of the one part and James M. Brale of the other part Whereas two writs of Capias ad Sativa eundem was issued out of the Clerk's Office of Southampton County in favor of James M. Brale against William Cobb directed to the Sheriff of said County, by virtue of which said writ the said Sheriff took into his Custody the above named William Cobb, in Order to deliver himself from the Custody of the Sheriff executed a Deed to the said Benjamin Dwany Sheriff of the County of Southampton Conveying his right in a tract of land lying in the County of Southampton Containing One hundred and thirty five acres, and after the said Sheriff pursuant to the provisions of an Act of the general Assembly in such cases made and provided, after having duly advertised the time and place of Sale, did on the 21st day of July 1834 before the Sheriff's Office in the town of Jumalow set up and sell at public auction the said tract of land Conveyed at that time the above named James M. Brale became the purchaser at the price of £10 being the highest bidder thereof. Now therefore this Indenture witnesseth to the said Benjamin Dwany Sheriff as aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of Ten dollars to him in hand paid by the said James M. Brale the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath given granted and sold and doth by these presents give grant, bargain and sell unto the said James M. Brale his heirs and assigns forever all the right Conveyed to him the said Benjamin Dwany Sheriff aforesaid by the Deed aforesaid executed to him by the aforesaid William Cobb, to have and to hold the aforesaid tract of land to him the said James M. Brale his heirs and assigns to the only proper use and benefit of him the said James M. Brale his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Benjamin Dwany as aforesaid hereby warrants and conveys to the said James M. Brale his heirs and assigns against the claim or demand of him the said Benjamin Dwany as aforesaid, or any person or persons claiming by through or under him, to the claim or demand of no other person or persons whomsoever. In Testimony whereof the said Benjamin Dwany Sheriff as aforesaid hath hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal the day and year first above written.
