This Indenture made and entered into this 21. day of July 1834. Between Benjamin
 Deputy Sheriff of the County of Southampton of the one part and James M. Beale of the
 other part Whereas two writs of Capias ad Satisfaciendum was sued out of the
 Office of Southampton County in favour of James M. Beale against William Corbett
 directed to the Sheriff of said County, by virtue of which said writ the said
 Sheriff took into his custody the above named William Corbett, in order to discharge
 himself from the custody of the Sheriff executed a deed to the said Benjamin
 Sheriff of the County of Southampton conveying his right in a tract of land lying in
 the County of Southampton containing one hundred and twenty five acres, and the
 the said Sheriff, pursuant to the provisions of an act of the general Assembly
 in such cases made and provided, after having duly advertised the time and place
 of sale, did on the 21. day of July 1834. before the Sheriff's Office in the town of
 Jerusalem set up and sell at public auction the said tract of land among, at the
 time the above named James M. Beale became the purchaser at the price of twelve
 he being the highest bidder thereof. Now therefore this Indenture witnesseth that
 the said Benjamin Deputy Sheriff as aforesaid for and in consideration of the
 sum of Ten dollars to him in hand paid by the said James M. Beale the receipt
 whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath given granted and sold and doth hereby
 presents give, grant, bargain and sell unto the said James M. Beale his heirs
 assigns forever, all the right conveyed to him the said Benjamin Deputy Sheriff
 aforesaid by the deed aforesaid executed to him by the aforesaid William Corbett. To have
 and to hold the aforesaid tract of land to him the said James M. Beale his heirs and
 assigns to the only proper use and behoof of him the said James M. Beale his heirs and
 assigns forever. And the said Benjamin Deputy Sheriff as aforesaid hereby warranteth
 the right aforesaid hereby conveyed to him the said James M. Beale his heirs and
 assigns against the Claims Ordinance of him the said Benjamin Deputy Sheriff
 as aforesaid, or any person or persons claiming by, through or under him the said
 the Claim Ordinance of no other person or persons whomsoever. In Witness
 whereof the said Benjamin Deputy Sheriff as aforesaid hath hereunto set his
 and affixed his seal the day and year first above written.
