Sparks Justices of the Peace in the County aforesaid in the State of Virginia do hereby certify that Delila Moore the wife of John Moore, parties as in our County aforesaid and being examined by us privately and apart from her husband and having the said aforesaid fully explained to her, she the said Delila Moore acknowledged the same to be her act and deed and declared that she had willingly signed sealed and delivered the same and that she wished not to retract it. This Indenture made this 17th day of October 1833 between Robert L. Simmons & Elizabeth his wife of the one part of Southampton & John Vick of the aforesaid County of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Robert L. Simmons & Elizabeth his wife for the consideration of the sum of to them in hand paid by the said John Vick at or before the executing and delivering of these presents, have bargained and sold by these presents to bargain & sell unto the said John Vick his heirs or assigns forever one half of the mill commonly known as Chicklons & purchased at public sale by Samuel Wells & Robert L. Simmons in conjunction also about five acres of land therefore attached it being one half of the mill purchased with the mill & it the same more or less. To have and to hold together with all the reversions & aversions, remainder and remainders, yearly & other rents issues & profits thereof & every part or parcel thereof, together with all the houses, orchards, ways, water courses & appurtenances thereto attached whatsoever belonging in any way or way appertaining thereto his heirs & assigns forever. To hold the said mill to him the said John Vick to him his heirs forever, and the said Robert L. Simmons & Elizabeth his wife for themselves their heirs or assigns both warrant and forever defend by these presents any person claiming or demanding of the said John Vick the same or any part thereof.
