Know all men by these presents that John F Stewart of State of Virginia and County of Southampton
for and on consideration of the sum of sixty dollars in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged
and both this day bargained, sold, transferred and delivered and by these presents doth bargain, sell, transfer
and deliver unto Ethelred Kitchen also of the State of Virginia and County of Southampton a certain
tract or parcel of land situated lying and being in the State of Virginia and County of Southampton
containing the quantity of fifty two acres more or less and bounded by lands of James Barber on the West, and by R. Montgomery on the South and being the same acquired
by John F Stewart of John Dick which will be seen by reference to the record of the County and State aforesaid
and the said John F Stewart doth covenant and agree with the said Kitchen its heirs administrators against any claims
whatsoever claiming by through or under him. In Testimony whereof I have subscribed my name
this twentieth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty four.

This Indenture made this 21st of April 1834 between Willis Bowring of the County of South-
ampton and parish of Stottingham of the one part and Watson Broadshaw of the said County and parish
of the other part Witnesses that the said Willis Bowring for and in consideration of the sum of sixty
dollars good and lawful money to him in hand paid by the said Watson Broadshaw the receipt
whereof the said Willis Bowring doth acknowledge himself fully and amply satisfied and paid hath
granted, bargained and sold unto the said Watson Broadshaw one certain tract or parcel of land and
premises situated and lying in the County aforesaid containing by estimation thirty one 1/2
acres to the same more or less and bounded on the South by Lawrence Joyner
lands, on the West by the lands of Matthew Bulls west, by Gordon Broadshaws land and East
by Lawrence Joyner land, together with all the houses, outhouses, edifices, buildings, yards, gardens
orchards, ways, water courses &c whatsoever belonging or in any way or wise appertaining to him
and his heirs forever and the said Willis Bowring for himself his heirs doth forever warrant
and forever defend by these presents any person or persons claiming or demanding the same or
any part thereof. In Testimony whereof the said Willis Bowring hath hereunto set his hand and
Seal this day and year first above written.
