This Indenture made this 15<sup>th</sup> day of September in the year of our Lord 1834 Between  
 William D Wood of the first part Auburn Middleton of the second part and William Lawrence of the  
 third part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia. Whereas the said William  
 Wood is justly indebted to the said William Lawrence in the sum of nineteen dollars and eighty-five  
 cents as by a bond bearing date by these presents with lawful interest thereon until paid and  
 said William D Wood is willing and desirous to secure. Now this Indenture witnesseth  
 that for and in consideration of the premises, and also for the further consideration of one dollar of  
 A Middleton - lawful money of Virginia to the said William D Wood in hand paid by the said Auburn Middleton  
 at and before the delivery and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged.  
 he the said William D Wood hath given, granted bargained, sold, alienated, released, released and  
 confirmed, and by these presents doth give, grant, bargain, sell, alienate, enfeoff, release and confirm,  
 the said Auburn Middleton his heirs and assigns forever, one feather bed and furniture, six wide  
 chairs, two tables, two chest and all my household and kitchen furniture. To have and to hold the  
 aforesaid feather bed & furniture, chairs, tables, chest &c unto the said Auburn Middleton his  
 exec. armor. and assigns forever. To the only proper use and behoof of the said Auburn Middleton his  
 heirs exec. armor. and assigns forever. And the said William D Wood for himself his heirs and  
 exec. armor. doth covenant, promise and agree to and with the said Auburn Middleton his heirs and  
 exec. armor. and assigns forever in manner and form following. That is to say, that the said William  
 Wood his heirs exec. armor. the aforesaid property hereby conveyed unto the said Auburn Middleton  
 his heirs exec. armor and assigns against all persons whatsoever, shall and will warrant and  
 forever defend by these presents. Upon Trust. Nevertheless, that the said Auburn Middleton his  
 exec. armor shall permit the said William D Wood to remain in quiet and peaceable possession of the  
 said property and take the profits thereof to his own use until required by William Lawrence to  
 whereupon the said Auburn Middleton shall after advertising the time and place and suitable  
 sell such of the said property as is herein conveyed and shall be necessary and sufficient to pay  
 said debt and interest to said William Lawrence and all expenses attending the sale -
