This Indenture made this the 15th day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand
 eight hundred and thirty four by and between Betsy Edwards of the County of Southampton
 and State of Virginia of the one part and Willis W. Lawrence of the County and State aforesaid
 of the other part. Witness that the said Betsy Edwards for and in consideration of the sum of
 thirty dollars to her in hand paid by the said Willis W. Lawrence at or before the making or
 delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said Betsy Edwards do hereby acknowledge
 herself to be therewith satisfied, contented and paid hath granted, bargained and sold, aliened
 and confirmed unto him the said Willis W. Lawrence his heirs and assigns forever a certain
 small tract or parcel of land lying in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia
 bounded as follows. Beginning at a spot or oak standing near the road a corner of said land
 line to a willow tree on Josiah Smith's line, thence along the said Smith's line to the river
 thence down the road to the first station, containing by estimation six and three fourths
 be the same more or less, together with the reversion or reversions, remainder, rents and profits
 issues and profits thereof. To have and to hold the said premises with the appurtenances
 and advantages of every kind whatsoever to the said tract to him the said Willis W.
 Lawrence his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Betsy Edwards for herself
 her heirs Executors and administrators do and will by these presents warrant and defend
 the said bargained premises with the appurtenances aforesaid against the lawful claim
 of all and every person or persons whatsoever unto him the said Willis W. Lawrence his heirs
