made and delivered the same and that she wished not to retract it. Given under our hands
and seals this 27 day of August 1834.

there annexed of the acknowledgment and being examined of Margaret Joyner wife of the said
Samuel Joyner admitted to record. And at Court held here for the County aforesaid the 18 day of
November 1834 the said Indenture and certificate were entered upon the records of the County.

This Indenture made and executed the twenty fifth day of May in the year of our Lord, one
thousand eight hundred and thirty three. Between Jesse Parker Sen. of the County of Southampton
of the one part, and Brady Edwards of the County of aforesaid and State of Virginia All together
that whereas John B. Miller of the County and State of aforesaid did by a certain Indenture in
last bearing date the 10 day of August 1832 and duly recorded in the County Court of South-
ampton, sell and convey unto Jesse Parker Sen. a certain tract or parcel of land lying and
being in the aforesaid County of Southampton containing seventy three acres more or less which the
said John B. Miller purchased from Albertson Edwards aforesaid, of record in the Clerk's
Office of the aforesaid County and marked and bounded as therein expressed: in trust to secure the
payment of the sum of twenty five dollars due Wiley W. Jenkins his heirs or assigns, to be sold
at any time after six months from the date of said Indenture in trust first advertising the
time and place of sale of the same in any public place near the residence of the said John B.
Miller for the specifications therein expressed: and the said land having been duly advertised
by the said Trustee as directed by the said Indenture in trust, the said tract of land with the
premises was exposed to public sale to the highest bidder on the 18 day of May 1833 where
Brady Edwards became the highest bidder and purchaser of the said land and premises for
the sum of sixty nine dollars - Now this Indenture All together that the said Jesse Parker Sen.
and in consideration of the circumstances aforesaid and for the further consideration of the sum
of sixty nine dollars to him in hand paid by the said Brady Edwards at or before the making
and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge, and thereof doth acquit
and discharge her the said Brady Edwards her heirs, Executors & assigns: hath given, granted, bar-
gained and sold, aliened, enfeoffed, and confirmed and by these presents doth give, grant, bargain
sell her enfeoff and confirm unto her the said Brady Edwards her heirs and assigns forever, a
certain tract or parcel of land and premises situate lying and being in the aforesaid County of
Southampton containing sixty three acres be the same more or less which is the same tract or parcel
of land as was conveyed by John B. Miller to Jesse Parker in a deed of trust the 10 day of
August 1832 as herein before mentioned, and for the purposes expressed or intended to be
