This Indenture made this fourth day of June one thousand eight hundred and thirty four between James
Harper of the Town of Fairfax County N.C. of the first part and John M. Barclay of the County of Southampton
State of Virginia of the second part. Witness both that whereas as the above named Thomas I. Harper is
legally seized and desirous to have himself Pitt Thomas of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia from
and to release all liability to come in consequence of his Securityship to me within several hundred and thirty three dollars bearing
date sometime in the early part of the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty three. the other bond
received by me with the said Pitt Thomas as Security to Henry R. Thompson bearing date one thousand
eight hundred and thirty one, in the month of February - as well as to secure the payment of a bond receiv-
ed by me the said Thomas I. Harper to Pitt Thomas for the sum of three hundred and forty four dollars
bearing date first day of November eight hundred and thirty three, and a bond received by me the said Thomas
I. Harper to Hays Maria Thomas for the sum of six hundred and twenty nine dollars dated first day of
January one thousand eight hundred and thirty four, with a credit entered in it of fifty eight dollars and fifty
one cents in the sixth day of February one thousand eight hundred and thirty four, and for and in consideration of
the sum of one hundred and thirty four dollars to me in hand paid by the said John M. Barclay of the County and State aforesaid, as and
before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged and I the said Thomas
I. Harper do by these presents bargain sell and confirm unto the aforesaid John M. Barclay his heirs assigns of
all my right title and interest in the estate of the late Henry Thomas deceased by his last will and testament with
his daughter Mary Jane, consisting of - land, negroes stock of all kinds household and kitchen furniture
two &c. also my interest in the estate of my late father Joseph M. Harper consisting of land negroes
stock of all kinds, household and kitchen furniture &c. being and lying in the County of Dinwiddie State
of Virginia now held as dower by his widow. To have and to hold the above named property unto him
the said John M. Barclay his heirs assigns and assigns forever and the aforesaid Thomas I. Harper doth
for himself his heirs assigns heirs and assigns forever warrant and defend all his right title interest in
the estate of the aforesaid Henry Thomas deceased and the estate of the aforesaid Joseph M. Harper as to
the said John M. Barclay his heirs and assigns forever. In Trust Nevertheless. Now this Indenture
Witnesseth that if the said Pitt Thomas as Security aforesaid of the aforesaid Thomas I. Harper
shall suffer or be likely to suffer in consideration of his Securityship aforesaid: or if the aforesaid
Pitt Thomas and Maria L. Thomas be likely to lose their aforesaid debts, the Trustee shall after
Ten days legal notice given to sell so much of the before mentioned property as shall be sufficient to pay
them or either one of them who shall think proper to secure the payment of their debts as the case may be, or
if the aforesaid Pitt Thomas shall be made to suffer in consequence of his Securityship to the aforesaid
