

This Indenture made and entered into this twenty seventh day of October one thousand eight hundred and thirty four between Samuel Pilkington of the County of Southampton of the first part, Thomas R. Gray of the second part and John Mezger of the third part. Witnesseth that the said Samuel Pilkington for and in consideration of the sum of five dollars to him in hand paid by the said J.R. Gray at or before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged. hath granted bargained sold conveyed released and assured unto the said J.R. Gray the following property to wit. Said Pilkington doth owe and owing together with all the household and kitchen furniture of the said Pilkington also a stock of clothing & other articles in the line of his business as a Saddle, which are his property (in and actually) and in no wise appertaining to the business which he is about to engage in, in the employ of Mr. Thomas J. Finney, also a parcel of corn and hays, and it is the intention of the conveyance that the said Gray shall have full power & control over the aforesaid control and the said Pilkington for himself his heirs & the aforesaid property to the said Gray his heirs Executors & etc. by these presents warrants and assured. Upon trust nevertheless that whereas the said Pilkington is justly indebted to John Mezger by three several bonds for the sum of two hundred and sixty six dollars & 66²/₃ for each, duties not remembered, say all the last of 1834 35 & 36 also to secure Pitt Thomas for a security ship to the firm of Wallace Stephens of Salisbury (amount not remembered) Now this Indenture witnesseth that the said Gray shall when ever required by the said Mezger or Thomas after giving lawful notice of the time and place of sale proceed to sell the aforesaid granted property and after paying the debts aforesaid pay over the balance and m^y from said sale and the profits of said stock in trade to the said Pilkington his heirs or assigns. and the said Gray covenants to and with the parties hereto faithfully to execute the trust hereby executed to him. Jones of Southampton County of the first part and Margaret Wallace of the second part. Witnesseth that the said Jones for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and twenty five dollars to him in hand paid at or before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged. hath granted, bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant, bargain and sell given and convey unto the said Margaret Wallace a certain tract or parcel of (land being) and being in the County of Southampton containing by estimation fifty acres be the same more or less with the appurtenances thereto belonging it being the same land bought by the said Jones of Samuel Robert Foster and the said said for himself his heirs Executors and administrators the said bond unto the said Margaret Wallace her heirs & etc. will forever wear and defend by these presents against the claims of them the said Foster
