S. Baldy Drake hath herunto set his hand and affixed his seal this day and date above
written.

This Indenture made and entered into this the 6th day of June in the year 1834 between
Lettice R Edwards of the first part Alexander Myrick Parker Barnett, Zebadiah Washington
Seniah Barrett, Benjamin Drake, Clements Rochelle, Thomas Newson, Elizabeth Smith and
John Barrett of the second part and Jacob Barrett of the third part. Whereas the said
Jacob Barrett on the 5th day of June in the year 1834 in order to secure the payment of certain
sums of money due from him to the parties above named of the second part, did by conveyance of
trails of that date convey to the said Lettice R Edwards his heirs executing and administrators
the following property to wit. Three certain tracts or parcels of land lying and being in the County
of Southampton; One tract containing one hundred and ten acres more or less which the said Jacob
Barrett purchased of Mary Barrett. One other tract containing six and a fourth acres which he
purchased of William Myrick and one other tract or parcel of land containing eighty nine acres
which he purchased of Elizabeth Smith, also his the said Jacob Barretts interest in the dower of his
mother Mary Barrett allotted to her out of the lands and slaves of her deceased husband Jacob Barrett
also the following Slaves and other personal property to wit. One negro boy Alfred, one white slave, one
white boy, and one girl named four horses and his the said Jacob Barretts proportion of the crops now
growing and which may be made on the plantations of the said Jacob Barrett and his mother Mary
Barrett and also all other property belonging to him the said Jacob Barrett or touched thereby in any
wise whether in trust for the use and purposes in the said indenture mentioned. And whereas since
the executing and delivering of the said indenture in writ the said Jacob Barrett hath fully satisfied &
paid to the said Alexander Myrick, Parker Barnett, Zebadiah Washington Seniah Barrett, Benjamin
Drake, Clements Rochelle, Thomas Newson, Elizabeth Smith and John Barrett the sums of money
thirty hundred and which they do hereby acknowledge. Now this Indenture witnessed that for
the consideration aforesaid, as well as for the further consideration of one dollar in hand paid by the
said Jacob Barrett to the said Lettice R Edwards and before the executing and delivery of these presents
