severally bound by these presents. Dated with our seals and dated this 18th day of November 1834.

The condition of the above obligation is such that, whereas the Court of Southampton County have
granted the above bound George G. Gray Commissioner of the Revenue for the Parish of St. Mary in
this said County for the term of one year And if the said George G. Gray shall faithfully perform
the duties of this said Office, during the term aforesaid then the above obligation to be void else to remain in
full force & virtue

Know all men by these presents that I Merod Summerville of the County of Southampton for and in
consideration of the natural Love and affection which I bear to my son in law James G. Jones of said County
as well as for the further consideration of one dollar to me in hand paid by the said James G. Jones, at or
before the making and delivery of these presents (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged here given and
granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said James G. Jones his Executors Admini-
strators and assigns) the following property real and personal one tract of land containing one hundred
square rods with the following personal estate one Gray mare; fifteen head of Hogs six head of cattle
and thirteen head of Sheep. One brace of Hounds, one pair of geese and the tools on the place
to wit: (the said Merod Summerville reserving to himself a life Interest in the said land for himself and
wife and what other family he may keep with him during his life) All have and to hold the
said land and personal estate as above described (with the exceptions above named) unto him the said
James G. Jones his heirs Executors Admini^s and assigns forever. And the said Merod Summerville for
himself his Executors & Admini^s the said land and personal estate as above unto the said James G. Jones
his Executors Administrators and assigns against the claim of him the said Merod Summerville his
Executors and Administrators and against the claim or claims of all and every other person persons
whatsoever (except the life Interest of the said Merod Summerville &c. as above stated) shall and
will warrant and forever defend by these presents In Witness whereof the said Merod
Summerville hath hereunto set his hand & seal this 18th day of January 1835.
