

This Indenture made this 29th day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and and his wife above named James H. H. Pond and Elizabeth Ann his wife of the County of Gloucester and State of Virginia of the one part and John A. Hill of same County and State of the other part witnesseth That the said James H. H. Pond Elizabeth Ann his wife in consideration of the sum of five hundred dollars of lawful money of this Commonwealth to him in hand paid by the said John A. Hill at or before the concluding and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged doth have bargained and sold, and by these presents doth and each of them doth sell and deliver unto the said John A. Hill his heirs and assigns, a certain tract of land lying and being in the County aforesaid containing by estimation two hundred and sixty-eight acres to the same more or less, and bounded as follows: Beginning at the lands of G. G. Gray on the East, William O. Bradley on the North, Wm. Henry Hammons on the West, and by Hill's Mill pond on the South, but more particularly described by the line Beginning at the Mill pond and running the west line of the said line of G. G. Gray on the East to a Road Oak tree, and then following said Gray's line on the South to a Spanish Oak tree, and then a pine tree, and from thence to a Hickory, thence to the Mill stream, thence to a pine alder tree following William O. Bradley's line to the north to a Maple alder tree, thence down the brook following Wm. Henry Hammons line to the Mill pond tracing the meander of the brook, to the said Mill pond, and thence along said Mill pond to the beginning. Together with all the singular houses, barns, buildings, stables, yards, gardens, orchards, lands, tenements, meadows, pastures, feedings, common rights, underrights, ways, watercourses, fishings, privileges, herofits, easements, cornices, advantages, embankments, fixtures, and appurtenances, whatsoever, to the said land belonging or appertaining thereto with the same used or enjoyed or excepted or left, taken or removed, parcel or manner thereof, or as belonging to the same or any part thereof and the revenue and other rents, issues and profits thereof and of every part and parcel thereof. To have and to hold the said tract of land with the tenements heredaments, and all and singular other the premises hereinbefore mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold and every part and parcel thereof, with every of their rights, members and appurtenances unto the said John A. Hill, his heirs and assigns forever; to and for the only proper use and benefit of him the said John A. Hill his heirs and assigns forever. And the said James H. H. Pond and Elizabeth Ann his wife for themselves and their heirs the said land with all undesignated premises and appurtenances before mentioned, unto the said John A. Hill his heirs and assigns from the claim or claims of them the said James H. H. Pond and Elizabeth Ann his wife or either of them their or either of their heirs and of all and every person or persons whatsoever, shall sell and so warrant and convey, defend by these presents In D. B. & J. S. who certify that the said James H. H. Pond and Elizabeth Ann his wife have executed all their hands and seals the day and year first above written.
