 of the said President and Directors of the Literary Fund and their Successors in Office for some cash or
 their Executors and administrators jointly and severally firmly by these presents drawn out
 and dated this 27th day of December 1834.
 The Condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the above bound Silas Summerville
 was on the day of 1834 by the School Commissioners in and for the County
 of Southampton appointed their Clerk as was for the year ending the 30th of December 1834
 it is if the said Silas Summerville shall faithfully apply and account for all moneys
 may come to his hands by virtue of his Office and shall do perform and execute all and every
 and thing appertaining to the said Office according to Law then when this obligation
 be void or else to remain in full force and virtue.

This Indenture made and entered into this 18th day of December in the year of our
 Christ One thousand eight hundred and thirty four Between Benjamin Davis of the
 County of Southampton in the State of Virginia of the one part and David Prince
 of the same County State of the other part Witnesseth that the said Benjamin Davis
 for and in consideration of the sum of Five hundred and forty Dollars lawfully money of
 this Commonwealth to him in hand paid at and for the execution of these presents
 hath granted, bargained, sold and by these presents doth grant, bargain, sell and con
 unto the said David Prince his heirs and assigns forever a certain parcel of land
 lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton, on the North and East of the
 path leading from the main Road running to the place known to James Myrick's place
 called Clatterbox, and containing by actual survey One hundred and twenty
 acres more or less, and bounded as is specified in the annexed plat of the said survey
 so with all the appurtenances and privileges to the same belonging and every
 appertaining to have and to hold the said land with all and singular
