Witnesseth that the said Matthew Harris as Executor aforesaid did on the 21st day of October 1834 sell to the best bid and the lands that Henry Harris did seized, acquire to his last Will and Testament, and the above named Benjamin M'Clenny became the purchaser thereof for the sum of seven hundred dollars of lawful money of this Commonwealth to the said Matthew Harris in hand paid at his knowledge here given, granted, bargained, sold (at public auction) and by these presents he gave, grant of lands, lying and being in the County aforesaid containing by Estimation seventy nine and three fourths Acre more or less and bounded by the lands of Henry Harris, Willis Brown and James Joyner, and James Joyner, as for more particulars being here well more fully appears with all the duties and rights thereunto and in and to the above mentioned land. It sheweth and to hold the said Benjamin M'Clenny his heirs and assigns forever with the three fourths parts and appurtenances thereto belonging or to come to be hereunto and sold, with every part and parcel thereof, unto the said Benjamin M'Clenny his heirs and assigns forever, and the said Matthew Harris (as Executor aforesaid) for himself, his heirs & the said land as above described doth give, grant and sell unto the said Benjamin M'Clenny his heirs and assigns forever from the Claim of him the said Matthew Harris and from all other persons persons claim or may claim or by him, shall and warrant and forever defend by these presents In Witness whereof the said Matthew Harris doth hereunto set his hand, and affixed his seal the day and year first above written
