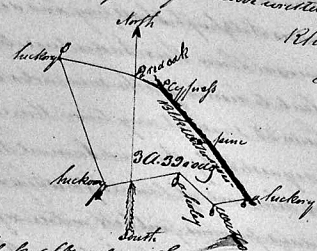

Fowler and Martha his wife have for and in consideration of the sum of fifty seven dollars and fifty cents to them in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, bargain and sold, alienate and confirm unto the said John Cobb the aforesaid tract of land with every part and parcel thereof and thereunto belonging by survey twenty seven acres and do by these presents bargain and sell, alienate and confirm unto the said John Cobb the aforesaid tract of land with every part and parcel thereof and thereunto belonging which is bounded as follows: Viz: Beginning at a post Oak in corner of this tract and George M. Blumley's tract thence S 85° E 2 1/2 p to a red Oak side line tree thence S 75° E 6 p to a Dogwood thence S 85° E 3 p to a Black gum thence S 75° E 10 p to a short gum thence S 81° E 12 p to a Black Jack thence S 87° E 10 p to a pine thence S 67° E 3 p to a black oak corner of this tract and Mary Bell in George M. Blumley's tract thence N 45° E 2 1/2 p to a pine thence S 30° E 4 p to a black gum in a sun branch thence N 45° E 2 1/2 p to a pine and corner of this tract and Mary Bell in the old line of the parcels of land belonging Martha Fowler and Mary Bell thence N 75° E 4 p to a pine thence N 50° E 3 1/2 p along a new line to a pine and corner of this tract and the part of Wm.
