

This Indenture made this 15th day of January in the year of our Lord 1835 between
 Matthew Harp and his wife Nancy of the one part, and James Harp of the other part
 of the County of Southhampton North of Newbery and State of Virginia. Whereas the said
 Matthew Harp and his wife Nancy in consideration of the sum of five hundred and fifty
 dollars to them in hand paid or secured to be paid by the said James Harp at or before the
 giving and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have given
 gained and sold, and by these presents do give grant bargain and sell unto the said James Harp
 his heirs and assigns by certain tract or parcel of land containing by estimation one hundred and
 five acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit beginning at a lightwood post on
 the William Lawrence line thence a line of marked trees in Jesse Johnsons line to a small oak tree
 on William Lawrence line thence said Lawrence line to a black gum in Henry Sammons line
 is a point near the road thence the road to Rebecca Lotters line thence her line to the beginning
 together with all and singular the houses outhouses, outhouses, buildings, gardens, pastures, woods
 waters and water courses with all the premises and appurtenances therunto belonging or in any
 wise appertaining to the same or any part or part or parcel thereof to have and hold to the said
 tract or parcel of land and all the premises and appurtenances therunto belonging or in any
 kind to be enjoyed with every part and parcel thereof unto the said James Harp his heirs and
 assigns forever and the said Matthew Harp and his wife Nancy for themselves their heirs
 and the said land unto the said James Harp his heirs and assigns forever free from all
 or claims of them the said Matthew Harp and Nancy his wife or either of them their
 heirs Executors Administrators and assigns, and from all and in other persons or persons who
 now shall and well warrant and forever defend by these presents In Witness whereof the
 Matthew Harp and Nancy his wife have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals
 the day and year first above written -
