 money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Wells S. Gray the receipt whereof the
 said Newt Johnson doth hereby acknowledge that he granted bargain sold and conveyed and by
 these presents doth grant bargain sell and convey to the said Wells S. Gray his heirs and assigns
 a certain tract or parcel of land containing twenty five acres be the same more or less lying in the
 County of Southampton lying on the South side of the Road from Swamp and known as
 follows to wit, beginning at point a corner for said Newt Johnson standing in line with the
 thence North to a black spike standing the North side of the South spring of the Road then
 a corner for said Newt Johnson standing in John Turners line thence North to the
 To the high water mark to a white Oak a corner for Wells S. Gray standing in John Turners
 thence South course across the Swamp to white Oak a corner for Newt Johnsons corner Right
 standing in Wells S. Gray's line thence a straight line a West Course to the beginning containing
 twenty five acres be the same more or less. To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land
 with the appurtenances thereto belonging to him the said Wells S. Gray his heirs and assigns forever
