of the one part and Mills S. Gray of the said County of the other part. Witnesseth that Newell  
Johnson for and in consideration of the sum of Thirty seven Dollars and fifty cents and  
money of Longview to him in hand paid by the said Mills S. Gray the receipt whereof  
said Newell Johnson with his wife Elizabeth and their children did and caused to be  
these presents doth grant bargain sell and convey to the said Mills S. Gray his heirs and  
a certain tract or parcel of land containing twenty five acres to the same more or less lying in the  
County of Southampton lying on the south frontage of the Buckhorn Swamp and bounded as  
follows to wit, beginning at joined a corner for said Newell Johnson standing under Hudson  
Hudson North to a black oak standing the North side of the South frontage of the Buckhorn  
a corner for John Turner and Newell Johnson standing in John Turner's line turning down Hudson  
to the high water mark to a white oak a corner for Mills S. Gray standing under Turner  
Turner South Course across the swamp to white oak a corner for Martha Johnson's down right  
standing in Mills S. Gray's line thence a straight line a West course to the beginning containing  
Twenty five acres to the same more or less. To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land
