 do hereby bind ourselves and our heirs, Executors and administrators jointly and severally
 to the just and full sum of Five thousand dollars to be paid to the said James Richards
 as for the use of the Commonwealth, to the payment whereof we will and truly to be made to the
 said James Richards and his Successors in law and estate, our heirs, Executors and administrators jointly and severally
 by these presents, Signed with our seals and dated this 16th day of March 1855
 The Condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the above James Samuel Holmes has been
 appointed by the Court of Southampton County to serve as Constable in the upper district of the
 Parish in the said County until June Court 1855 in the place of Thomas B. Jordan. Now if the said
 shall well and truly discharge the duties of the Office of Constable in the said District during the
 continuance therein then the above obligation to be void or else to remain in full force and effect

Bryant This Indenture made and entered into this 17th day of March 1855 between Sugars Bryant
 of the County of Southampton of the first part and Thomas B. Gray of the second part and John Thomas
 Gray of the third part Witnesses that the said Sugars Bryant for and in consideration of the sum of Ten
 dollars to him in hand paid by the said T. B. Gray at or before the making and delivery of these
 presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted conveyed sold and conveyed unto
 these presents doth grant bargain sell and convey unto the said Gray all the right title interest claim
 or demand which he the said Sugars Bryant hath in and to the estate of Nathaniel Howard late
 deceased. To have and to hold the said granted property or interest to him the said Gray his heirs and assigns
 against the claim or demand of him the said Bryant his heirs &c. and every person or persons
 whatever Upon trust nevertheless that whereas the said Thomas is security for the said Sugars Bryant
 he shall pay to him the said Sugars Bryant by him the said Thomas for the amount of about six hundred dollars also one to the said Bryant
 for one hundred dollars, also one to the said T. B. Gray for fifty dollars the date of the said bond and
 being collected and being anxious to secure the payment of the same. Now this indenture is made
 in witness whereof the said Gray shall witness who is required either by the said John Thomas or Sugars
 Bryant after giving public notice of the time and place of sale proceed to sell the aforesaid
 granted interest in property and after first paying the aforesaid debts the interest and balance
 may be due thereon and the expense of this conveyance pay over the balance of any the said Sugars
 or John Thomas when the parties have hereunto set their hands and seals This conveyance made
 above written
