

This Indenture made this the 7th day of March in the year of our Lord 1835 between Matthew
 Williams of the first part and John Moore Trustee of the second part and Thomas Proctor of the third part
 Whereas the said Matthew Williams is justly indebted to the said Thomas Proctor in the sum of five
 hundred and thirty six dollars due by bond bearing date the 8th of March 1835 more fully appears
 which debt with the legal interest thereon accruing the said Matthew Williams is willing and desirous
 to secure Now This Indenture witnesseth that in consideration of the further sum of one dollar
 of lawful money of Virginia to the said Matthew Williams in hand paid by the said John Moore
 at and before the making and delivery of these presents their receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
 by the said Matthew Williams both for form granted bargain and sold sold released and confirmed and
 by these presents doth give bargain and sell now conform to the said John Moore his heirs and
 assigns forever the following slaves to wit Samu^l & Andrew man & Mary both about the same age and
 complexion about thirty years old, all the estate right title and interest of the said Matthew Williams
 in and to the said slaves Sam & Bailey hereby conveyed unto the said John Moore his heirs
 administrators and assigns forever and the said Matthew Williams for himself doth hereby consent
 promise and agree that the said John Moore his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns forever
 in the manner and form following that is to say the said Matthew Williams his heirs executors &
 administrators the aforesaid slaves hereby conveyed unto the said John Moore his heirs, executors and
 administrators against all persons whatsoever shall and will warrant and defend by these
 presents Upon trust nevertheless that the said John Moore his heirs executors and administrators
 shall permit the said Matthew Williams to remain in quiet and peaceable possession of the
 aforesaid slaves Sam & Bailey hereby conveyed and take the profits to his complete untill de-
 fault be made in the payment of the said sum of five hundred and ^{six} ~~thirty~~ dollars in whole or in
 part and that upon this further trust that he or either of his survivors or his heirs or executors
 administrators shall and will as soon after the happening of default or payment and being
 required by the said Thomas Proctor his heirs executors administrators or assigns shall sell
 the aforesaid slaves to the highest bidder for ready money at public auction after having
 first advertised the place of sale ten days at least at the most public place or at the Court
 house door of the County on some Court day previous to the day of sale and out of the mo-
 ney arising from such sale shall satisfy the charges thereof and all expenses attending
 the premises shall pay to the said Thomas Proctor his heirs executors administrators or
 assigns the sum of five hundred and thirty six dollars with the interest thereon lawfully have
 accrued and the balance if any pay to the said Matthew Williams his heirs executors admin-
 istrators or assigns In Witness whereof the said parties to these presents have unto set their
 hands and fixed their seals the day and year first above written
