This Indenture made and entered into this 15<sup>th</sup> day of November in the year 1834, between John  
Mason and Mary Ann his wife of the County of Southampton of the first part, and Sterling  
Sligo of the second part, Witnessed by: That for and in consideration of the sum of Twelve hun-  
dred dollars to them in money paid before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the  
receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, they the said John Mason and Mary Ann his wife  
have hereunto, sold, conveyed, granted by these presents, do hereby sell and convey unto the said  
Sterling Sligo, one certain tract of land lying, and being, situate in the said County of Southamp-  
ton, in the South Side of the stone Creek, containing three hundred and two acres more or less, sit-  
uate that portion of the lands of James Harpell dec'd, which, in the division of his estate was  
allotted to his daughter, Annister, and by her and her husband James Crofton, by their deed dated  
the sixth day of September 1830, conveyed in Trust to Robert Bingham Junr and by him sold at  
auction in pursuance of said deed, to the said John Mason, it being called the "Hill pasture"  
To have and to hold the said tract of land with its appurtenances to him the said  
Sterling Sligo, and to his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Mason and wife, for  
himself, and through him, Covenant with the said Sligo and his heirs and assigns, that  
he shall have and enjoy a good title to the said land free from the claims of all persons
