 off. And on the tract or parcel of land purchased of John Thomas in his life time by Henry Thomas in
 his life time containing fifty one acres more or less lying in the County of Southampton on the South
 side of Hottelung River and bounded as follows beginning at a black gum in a small branch thence up S 2
 bound the various courses 154 poles to the fork of another thence down the said branch bounding on Henry Thomas
 and the line the various courses 902 poles to a corner white oak thence due east a new line of marked
 trees to the first 51 Acres more or less. And another tract purchased by Henry Thomas in his life time
 of George S Thomas, lying and being in the County of Southampton on the South side of Hottelung
 River containing by estimation two hundred and twenty three acres more or less and bounded as follows.
 beginning at a small white oak standing at Hock's Spring thence a long a line of marked trees to a
 corner of John Thomas and Henry Thomas line in the side of a small branch thence down the S 2
 branch to a large white oak thence along a line of marked trees to a great branch thence down the S 2
 branch to the beginning. And also another tract purchased of John Thomas by wife by the said Henry
