Nash, and by these presents doth give, grant, bargain, sell, alien, release and confirm to the said George W. F. Nash his heirs and assigns forever a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton State of Virginia containing 300 acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit: Beginning at the corner and bounded on the north by the lands of John B. Hill, on the west by the lands formerly Richard Williamson, on the South by the lands of John Phillips, Burnell Cornett, and James Barnes, and East by the lands of the said John B. Hill; also the following slaves, Negro fellow named John age abt 28 years, a woman named Hannah, & girl named Ira age five years, a woman age 25 years in same County (and all my stock in Trade Consisting of my goods, household, furniture or any other article of Trade with all and singular the appurtenances of said tract or parcel of land belonging or in any wise appertaining and all the estate right title and interest of the said E. J. Hill in & to the same
