This Indenture made this fourteenth day of February in the year of our Lord One
thousand eight hundred and thirty five Between George Williams of the County of
Southampton & State of Virginia of the One part and Sclibiah Bryant of the same
County and State of the other part Witnesseth that the said George Williams
for and in consideration of the sum of Twelve dollars and fifty Cents Current money of
Virginia of him in hand paid by the said George Williams at or before the making
and delivery of these presents the right whereof is thereby acknowledged have
granted bargain and sold and by these presents they and each of them doth
thoroughly grant bargain, and sell, alien, enfeoff convey and confirm unto the said
Sclibiah Bryant his heirs and assigns forever all their right full interest claim
or demands, of in and to certain tract of land lying and being in the County of Southampton
and in the parish of Saint Luke's, by a late survey containing Two Acres & a half
more or less as follows (To Wit), Beginning at a Shrub Oak on the West side in Bryant's line
then running the West side to the Swamp, then down the said Swamp to Sclibiah
Bryant's line a South Course then along the said Bryant's line an east Course
to the Shrub Oak at the Beginning containing Two & a half Acres more or less all
the right full interest claim or demands of him the said George Williams to
Have and to Hold the said tract of land and premises with its appurtenances unto
the said Sclibiah Bryant his heirs and assigns forever. To the only proper use and behoof
of the said George Williams for himself his heirs & assigns forever to have and
enjoy and defend the right and title to the same and every part and parcel thereof against
all and every person or persons whatsoever. In Witness whereof the said George Williams
himself has hereunto set his hand and affixed this seal this day first year above
written.
