Hill held in the lands of his father at the death of his mother Maud Hill which was an undivided interest was, this day after having been regularly advertised as required by the Trust deed sold at Public auction in Jerusalem by the Will for the sum of three hundred and fifty dollars wherefor this indenture that appears former all right and title which was vested in me as Trustee by E. S. Hill is a certain tract of land left by William Hill containing about 300 acres and bounded as before described. To have and to hold the same with all right interests and appurtenances thereto attached to her and her heirs forever.

This deed of bargain and sale is to be considered as a release of all the interest which I as Trustee have in the lands aforesaid to the estate of William Hill.

Sebell and James M. Sebell of the third part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia Whereas the said Joseph Drury stands justly indebted to Sampson Little with the said Nicholas M. Sebell and James M. Sebell his securitys in a bond for the sum of Two hundred and seventy three dollars or thereabouts bearing date March the 6th 1835 and payable the 30th day of December 1837 and the said Joseph Drury being desirous to save himself the said Nicholas M. Sebell and James M. Sebell his securitys to the bond aforesaid And this indenture here witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and for the further consideration of the sum of One dollar in the said Joseph Drury in hand paid by the said William S. Hill at or before the signing and delivery of this presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Joseph Drury that he gives grants bargained and sold and by these presents do give grant bargain and sell to the said William S. Hill his heirs and assigns forever all that tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton which the said Joseph Drury purchased of Sampson Little and bounded by the lands of Charles C. Upphart, J. B. Semmes, Maud M. Semmes & Susanna Cobb, containing two hundred and forty acres with all the interest right title claim or demand in and to the said
