This Indenture made the 2nd day of May In the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty five Wilson Weldon and his wife Martha of the County of Lancaster and Louisa Lewis of the other part all of the County of Southampton and in consideration of the sum of Eighty dollars of lawful money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said Louisa Lewis at or before the making and delivery of these presents (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) Have bargained and sold and by these presents do and each of them with bargain and sell unto the said Louisa Lewis her heirs and assigns one certain tract plantation or parcel of land containing by estimation twenty acres more or less lying and being situate in the County of Southampton lying on the east side of the main road from Jerusalem to Smiths River bounded by the lands of said Wilson Weldon and by the Round Hill run and being all the lands the said Wilson Weldon owns on that side of the road together with all and singular the houses, barns, buildings, stables, yards, gardens, orchards, lands, tenements, meadows, pastures, fishing, conveniences, woods, underwoods, ways, waters, watercourses, fishing, emoluments, hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the said land belonging or appertaining or with the same used enjoyed or accepted reputed taken or known as part parcel or member thereof or as belonging to the same or in any part thereof and the reversions and reverses remainders and remainders yearly and other rents issues and profits thereof and of every part and parcel thereof. To Have and to Hold the said tract of land with the tenements hereditaments and all and singular other the premises herein mentioned or intended, to be bargained and sold and every part and parcel thereof with every of their rights members and appurtenances unto the said Louisa Lewis her heirs and assigns forever to and for the only proper use and behoof of her the said Louisa Lewis her heirs and assigns forever And the said Wilson Weldon and Martha Weldon his wife for themselves their heirs the said Louisa Lewis with all and singular the appurtenances before mentioned unto the said Louisa Lewis her heirs and assigns forever free from the claim or claims of them the said Wilson Weldon and Martha Weldon his wife or either of them their or others heirs and of all and every persons or persons whatsoever shall and well warrant and for ever defend by these presents.
