 the money arising from such sale after paying the charges attending the same
 pay to the said Edward Ruttle his heirs executors and assigns the sum of
 seventy One dollars seventy & three quarters Cents with lawful interest thereof
 and the balance of any pay over to the said Robert Whiteland or his legal
 representatives. But of the aforesaid sum of money and the legal interest
 thereon shall be fully paid off so that no default of payment be made
 thus this Indenture to be Void or else remain in full force and Virtue.
