This Indenture made and entered into this the 10th day of August the thousand eight hundred and thirty five between William C Parker and Eliza C his wife of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the One part and Benjamin Wicks of the same County and State of the Other part: Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of two thousand dollars good and lawful money, to the said William C Parker and Eliza C his wife in hand paid by the said Benjamin Wicks many the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged they the said William C Parker and Eliza C his wife have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said Benjamin Wicks his heirs and assigns all that meadow and tract of land called Rebeccas situated by river and lying and being in the County of Southampton containing by actual survey three hundred and eighty one Acres be the same more or less and also all trees, woods, underwoods, ways, watercourses, houses, profits, advantages, hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the said meadow &c above mentioned belonging or in any wise appertaining and the rents and revenues remainder and remainder rents profits and profits of the said premises and every part and parcel thereof and also the same right title interest claim and demand in that power of them the said William C Parker and Eliza C his wife of, to and to the said Benjamin Wicks and premises &c being the same tract or parcel of land purchased by the said William C Parker of Deborah Ann Wicks his wife and which was devised to the said Deborah Ann Wicks by her father and Wicks
