

who died at the time of his death under a deed of gift from his father Benjamin Rickles dated the 15<sup>th</sup> day of July 1810 and duly recorded in the Clerk's Office of the County Court of Southampton, which said deed describes the premises as follows to wit: "Beginning at a small sloping tree near the bank of a stream now called the River Tuck near the banks of Notley river being the dividing line between Alexander McFaul's line and the above mentioned tract of land thence North 47° E 108 1/2 poles to a small Gun Thence N 11° E 12 1/2 poles to a new style Cyprep on said line and in a branch thence down the course of said branch bearing West of North to a corner Cyprep in Thomas Rickles line and thence along said bearing East and bounded by said Thomas Rickles line to another Cyprep a new corner thence bearing East along the said branch to the nearest the post or sign post thence down the Flag run swamp to a Pine tree and thence South 43° East 102 1/2 poles to a corner Maple in a small run thence along Richard Rickles line to the Flag run swamp thence up the said swamp to a black gum in Escon Shelly line thence South 66° West 81 1/2 poles to the road thence along the 353 poles to a pale Oak standing on the side of the road thence South 97° West 166 poles to a stately bark tree standing on the bank of Notley river thence up the various courses of said river to the beginning." To have and to hold the said meadow and premises and every part and parcel thereof with the appurtenances unto the said Benjamin Henry his heirs and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of the said Benjamin Henry his heirs and assigns forever. And the said William C Parker and Eliza his wife for themselves and their heirs the said meadow and premises and every part thereof against them and their heirs and so far as the title is now in them against all and every person and persons whatsoever like said Benjamin Henry his heirs and assigns shall and will warrant and defend. In witness whereof the said William C Parker and Eliza his wife have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and year first before written.

The undersigned Justice of the peace in the County of Prince George in the State of Virginia do hereby certify that Eliza C Parker wife of William C Parker parties to a certain deed bearing date on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of August 1835 and hereinabove annexed personally appeared before us in our County aforesaid and being examined by us properly and apart from her husband and having therewith a sufficient fully explained to her who the said Eliza C Parker has acknowledged the same to be her act and deed and declares that she has willingly signed, sealed and delivered the same and that she wished not to retract it.
