Mypick's Sale This Indenture made and entered into this 3rd day of June in the year One thousand
 to and eight hundred and thirty five between James Mypick and Philo M. Maso
 Musgrave's wife of the first part John J. Mason of the second part and Robert Tolliver
 of the third part: Whereas the said James Mypick is indebted to the said
 Musgrave in the sum of One Thousand dollars of lawful money with interest
 to R. J. Musgrave from this date by bond of equal date with these presents the payment of said
 for one - With said sum of money and interest the said James Mypick is willing and desirous
 May 1835 to secure: This Indenture Wetherseth that for and in consideration of the price
 ides one of the sum of One dollar to them in hand paid by the said Mason
 before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
 The said James Mypick and Wife have bargained and sold and by their
 presents do bargain and sell unto the said John J. Mason one Tract of land situate
 on the Three Cracks Commonly called Wetherseth, A being the same Tract of
 land which the said Mypick purchased of Hester P. Pate as adm^r of
 Edward Rees dec^d the miles and bounds whereof are fully set forth in the case
 from this said Tract of record in the Clerk's Office of Southampton County and
 also the following slaves to wit: Patrick, Jack, Eli, Cambridge, Festus, Mary
 White, Matilda, Mary and Esau with the future increase of the females.
 To Have and to Hold the said Tract of land with the premises and the said
 Negro slaves to him the said Mason his Exors or adm^rs forever. Upon Trust
 nevertheless that the said James Mypick shall retain possession of the said
 property until the said Mason shall be by the said Musgrave or his Exors or
 the payment of the said sum of money and interest, requisite to take possession
 of the said slaves and land, whereupon the said Mason shall after duly
 advising the time and place of sale for two days sell the same or a sufficient
 for the purpose one of the proceeds in cash pay first the expenses of this deed
 then the debt and interest aforesaid to the said Musgrave or his Exors or
 and the balance if any to the said Mypick or his Exors And the said Mypick
 and wife Covenant that the said Mason shall have a good and perfect title
 to the said land and slaves and possession thereof for the purpose of this deed.
