This Indenture made and entered into this twenty sixth day of february in the year of our Lord
One thousand eight hundred and thirty five by and between Deborah Anne McKee of the State of Ohio
of the one part and William C. Parker of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the other
part Witnesseth that for and in consideration of fifteen hundred and twenty five dollars & no more
and lawful money of the receipt whereof she doth hereby acknowledge and former receipt here-
in said William C. Parker the said said Deborah Anne McKee hath granted bargain and sold unto the said William C. Parker
his heirs and assigns all those meadows and tract of land called Redden, situate lying
and being in the County of Southampton containing by actual survey three hundred and
eighty six acres be the same more or less, and also all trees woods undrained swamps water-
courses houses fences and advantages heretofore and appurtenances whatsoever to the same
meadows and ^{the} meadows belonging or in any wise appurtenant and the remainder and rem-
ains, division and divisions, parts of parts and profits of the said premises and every part and
parcel thereof also all the ~~entire~~ right title interest claim and demand whatsoever of her
the said Deborah Anne McKee of in and to the said meadows and premises situate lying the same
tract or parcel of land devised to the said Deborah Anne McKee by the last will and Testament
of her late father Andrew McKee who died at the time of his death under a deed of gift
from his father Richard McKee dated the seventeenth day of July in the year of our Lord one thou-
sand eight hundred and ten and duly recorded in the Clerk's Office of the County Court of Southamp-
ton which said deed describes the boundaries as follows to wit: Beginning at a small spring tree
near the South of Anthony Rivers called the cross tree being the dividing line between Alexander
McNair's land and the above mentioned tract of land thence North by E 108 7/8 poles to a post
then thence North N. East 12 1/2 poles to a new Chesped Cypress in said line and in a straight line
from the corner of said branch bearing West of North to a corner Cypress on Thomas McKee's line
and thence along a line bearing East and bounded by the said Thomas McKee's line to another
Cypress a new corner thence bearing East along the said branch to the road over the ford
or log post thence down flag run swamp to a spring in Thomas McKee's line thence South 13 East
132 poles to a corner Maple in a small dash thence along Rebecca McKee's line to the flag run swamp
thence up the said swamp to a black burn in James McKee's line thence South 66 West 8 1/2 poles
to the road thence along the road 55 1/2 poles to a post Oak standing on the side of the road thence
South 77 West 166 poles to a stubb tree standing on the bank of Anthony Rivers thence up
the various courses of the river to the Beginning. To Have and to hold the said meadows
and premises and every part and parcel thereof with the appurtenances and the same
