This Indenture made and entered into this 22nd day of September 1835 between Edward Butts
of the one part and William Vick of the other part all of the County of Southampton. Witness by
a Notary of the County of Southampton present and abiding Town 1835 in a case then under
pending: Between James Story Plaintiff and William Vick defendant it was agreed that Edward
Butts be appointed a Trustee to sell the property conveyed in deed of Trust when required so to do
from William Vick to James Bishop (sic) for the benefit of James Story after giving legal notice of
time and place of sale to the provisions of the said Deed. And whereas in pursuance of the said
deed the said Edward Butts did on the 22nd day of September 1835 cause to be sold a certain
tract or parcel of land in the said deed of Trust mentioned (called the Holly place containing two
hundred acres (which is alluded to in the said deed) sufficient notice of the time and place of sale
formerly having been given at least thirty days and whereas at the said sale Edward Butts became the purchaser of the said land being the highest bidder thereof at the sum of four
hundred and fifty five dollars. This Indenture therefore witnesseth that the said Edward
Butts in consideration of the said sum of four hundred and fifty five dollars to him on hand
paid by the said William Vick before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt
whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do
grant bargain and sell and convey unto the said William Vick his heirs and assigns the
tract of land above referred to containing two hundred acres together with the appurtenances
thereunto belonging. To Have and to Hold the said tract or parcel of land with the
appurtenances to the said William Vick his heirs and assigns to the only proper and
lawful of him the said William Vick his heirs and assigns forever. And the said
Edward Butts for himself his heirs executors and administrators hereby covenant to and with
the said William Vick his heirs and assigns that he will forever warrant and defend the
said tract of land lawfully conveyed with the appurtenances thereto belonging to the said
William Vick his heirs and assigns against the claim of him the said Edward Butts his
executors or assigns and of all persons claiming the same or any part thereof by from through or
under him but against the claim of no other person whatsoever. In Witness whereof the said
Edward Butts have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this day and year first
before written.
