This Indenture made and entered into the 19th day of October in the year One thousand eight hundred and thirty five between Samuel Pollington of the County of Southampton & State of Virginia of the first part and Edmund Beale of the County and State aforesaid of the second part and J. R. Bray of the third part. Witnesseth that whereas the said Samuel Pollington being desirous to engage in the business of a Saddler his calling and occupation and not having funds to commence the same as desired and the said E. Beale being willing to aid and assist him in the business aforesaid, it is agreed between the said Samuel Pollington and the said E. Beale, that the said E. Beale shall advance the sum of five hundred dollars to be paid out and expended in the purchase of Leather and all other implements and materials fit and proper for the use and business of a Saddler and the said Samuel Pollington do and fully agree to work up and manufacture the same as a Saddler by his own labor, and the labor of his workmen and apprentices, and it is further agreed that this transaction and contract aforesaid, shall exist for three years unless, unless either of the parties shall choose to settle and close the same before the expiration of that time from the date hereof, which may be done in manner hereafter expressed and it is further agreed that after allowing the said J. R. Bray a fair Compensation for his services and the losses of his shop, taking into account the disbursement of the same and giving the said E. Beale or for money thus advanced and the interest thereon, the profits if any shall be equally divided between the said J. Pollington. If the said E. Beale and whereas the said Samuel Pollington is anxious to leave and disengage himself from the said Edmund Beale, on account of the money thus advanced, now for and in consideration of the premises as well for the further consideration of five hundred dollars to him in hand paid by the said J. R. Bray at or before the concluding and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said J. Pollington, hath granted, conveyed, sold and conveyed unto the said J. R. Bray all the right title interest claim and demands which he the said Samuel Pollington hath in and to the stock in trade which he now carries on or is about to carry on as aforesaid in the form of Sewalens as well in any and all sundry materials as these manufactured or to be manufactured in manner aforesaid. To Have and to hold the aforesaid granted stock in trade and all and singular the articles aforesaid thus conveyed or to be conveyed to the said Bray to his only proper use and behoof of him the said Bray his heirs, Executors, and assigns. And the said J. Pollington for himself his heirs &c. etc.
