Parham Sheriff as aforesaid before the sealing of this present the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said James Brattle in the said Brattle hath granted bargained released confirmed and sold unto the said Wm. Parham Sheriff aforesaid and by these presents doth grant bargain release confirm and sell to the said Wm. Parham Sheriff as aforesaid to him his heirs executors administrators and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton containing by estimation forty two and a half acres, and bounded by the lands formerly belonging to Edmund Long, Jackson Brattle, Lewis A Branch and others with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging. To Have and to Hold the aforementioned tract or parcel of land together with the appurtenances thereto belonging unto the said Wm. Parham Sheriff as aforesaid his heirs executors administrators and assigns and the said James Brattle for himself his heirs executors administrators and assigns shall warrant and will forever defend unto the said Wm. Parham Sheriff as aforesaid his right and title to the aforementioned tract or parcel of land, against all and every person or persons wheresoever.
