This Indenture made and entered into this day of November in the year One thousand eight hundred and thirty five between Sarah Jolly of the first part Sarah W Jordan of the second part and Bartholomew Lightfoot of the third part all of the County of St. of Wright Wicks of Virginia Whereas the said Sarah Jolly is fully indebted to the said Sarah W Jordan in the sum of One hundred and forty four dollars & twenty six cents due by her bearing date with these presents the fragment of which sum of money with the interest accruing thereon the said Sarah Jolly is willing and desires to secure to the said Sarah W Jordan her heirs or assigns This Indenture therefore witnesseth that the said Sarah Jolly for and in and to the use of the said Sarah W Jordan has here and before paid unto her the said Sarah Jolly in hand paid by the said Bartholomew Lightfoot at and before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Sarah Jolly hath given quitclaim bargain and sold and by these presents doth give quitclaim and sell unto the said Sarah W Jordan her heirs and assigns all her the said Sarah Jolly's right and to claim direct slaves, now held ^{and} in the possession of Elizabeth Boykin widow and relict of James Boykin one half of the County of Southampton together with her the said Jolly's interest in the increase of the females of said Slave Slaves To Have and to hold the said Jolly's interest claim and demand in and to the said Sarah W Jordan with the increase of the females thereof unto the said Bartholomew Lightfoot his heirs and assigns: To the only proper use and behoof of him the said Bartholomew Lightfoot his heirs and assigns from Upon this official trust that the said Bartholomew Lightfoot shall provide the said Sarah Jolly Jolly generally and quietly to hold to hold his interest in the aforementioned Slave Slaves until the said Sarah W Jordan his heirs Executors administrators or assigns shall receive payment of the aforementioned sum of money with interest thereon: that when such payment shall be received the said Bartholomew Lightfoot his heirs &c shall proceed to sell at public auction for cash (after having advertised the time and place of sale at least twenty days previous thereto) the said Sarah Jolly's interest in the aforementioned Slave Slaves with the future increase of the females thereof: that out of the proceeds arising from such sale first pay all costs and charges attendant thereon then pay unto the said Sarah W Jordan his heirs Executors the aforementioned sum of money with interest and the surplus (if any) pay over to the said Sarah Jolly his heirs and assigns: But if the said Sarah Jolly shall pay off and discharge the said debt with interest when required thereon This Indenture is to remain in full force and virtue until the day whereof the parties to these presents have hereunto set their hands and seals the day and year first above written
