This Indenture made and entered into this twenty-ninth day of October, one thousand
one hundred and thirty-five, by and between Samuel Blunt Junr. Executor, of Samuel Blunt
late deceased, of the County of Southampton of the first part and George A. W. Newsom
of the said County, and State of Virginia of the second part witnesseth: That whereas
the said Samuel Blunt senior, deceased, died by his last Will and Testament duly proved
and recorded in the Office of the Clerk of the County Court of Southampton County,
among other things, avised and directed that all his lands lying on the East side of
Buckhorn Swamp, at the death of his wife should be sold by his Executor either publicly
or privately as he might think fit, and whereas the testator's wife had died and the
Executor pursuant to the directions of his testator, did in his discretion under the
said last Will and Testament after duly and properly advertising the time and place,
on the twentieth day of October, in the year aforesaid, sell at publick Auction to the
highest bidder, on a credit of one, two and three annual installments, the said tract of
land containing one Thousand and sixty acres more or less, subject to a reservation of sixty
acres, at, around and belonging to the family burying ground and for the use
of the family, as indicated by posts recently stuck up and now standing, and the said
George A. W. Newsom was the highest bidder and purchased the said tract of land at
the sum of Two thousands three hundred and ten dollars, now therefore the said Samuel
Blunt Junr. Executor of Samuel Blunt Senr., deceased, with these presents grant, bargain,
sell and convey to the said George A. W. Newsom the said tract of land of one thousand
and sixty acres, more or less, bounded on the East by the Buckhorn Swamp on the North
East, North and North West by the Lands belonging to the Estate of Stith Nicholson aforesaid,
on the West and South West by the Lands of Joseph A. Berkem and Nathaniel Simmons
and on the South by the Lands of the said Simmons and Edwin Waller a the beginning
to have and to hold to him, his heirs and assigns forever, and the said Samuel Blunt
Junr. Executor of Samuel Blunt Senr., deceased, doth hereby covenant and with the said
George A. W. Newsom in consideration of the premises and the assurances of the said George
A. W. Newsom to secure the respective annual installments according to the terms of the sale
of the bargained premises which are hereby acknowledged to have been done and given, and
with which the said Samuel hereby acknowledges himself satisfied with hereby binds himself as
Executor as aforesaid to warrant and defend unto the said George A. W. Newsom his heirs and af-
frees forever a good and effectual title in fee simple, of, in and to, the bargained premises
against the heirs of the said Samuel Blunt Senr., deceased and all other persons whatsoever
