fully explained to her, she the said Sally Ellsworth acknowledged the same to be her  
act and deed and that she hath willingly signed, sealed and delivered the same,

This Indenture made and entered into on the Sixteenth day of November in the  
year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and thirty five between Jacob Barnes of the County  
of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Henry Hinman  
of the same County and State of the other part, witnesseth that the said Jacob  
Barnes for and in consideration of the sum of twenty-one dollars and twenty-five  
cents money of the Commonwealth to him in hand paid by the said Henry  
Hinman at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof  
is hereby acknowledged, hath granted, bargained and sold and by these presents doth  
grant, bargain, sell alien enfeoff and conform unto him the said Henry Hinman  
his heirs and assigns forever, one certain tract or parcel of land, private, lying  
and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and Parish of Saint Luke containing  
by a recent survey, four of a quarter Acres (be the same more or less) and bounded  
as follows, to wit, beginning at a small Goodman tree standing in the fork of  
two small branches a new corner for said Jacob Barnes, thence down the run of  
branch 23 poles to the mouth of another small branch a corner in said Henry  
Hinman's line, thence up the run of branch along said Henry Hinman's line  
35 1/2 poles to a Poplar thence his line of marked trees N 41 1/2° E 37 poles to  
a pine in branch a corner for said Jacob Barnes and Henry Hinman, thence  
down the run of branch along said Jacob Barnes' line 32 poles to the first  
Station. Together with all rights, title, interest claim or demands of, in and to the  
aforesaid tract or parcel of land and premises with its appurtenances thereto  
belonging or in any wise appertaining. To have and to hold the above
