This Indenture made and entered into the 28th day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty five between Dempsey Blythe, the first party of the one part and Anthony M. Hewel of the other part, witnesseth, that for and in consideration of two hundred and seventy-five dollars current money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said Anthony M. Hewel, the said Dempsey Blythe and his wife have bargained and sold and by these presents do and of them doth bargain and sell unto the said Anthony M. Hewel his heirs and assigns one certain tract or parcel of land containing by estimation one ty-five acres to the same more or less, being the tract formerly purchased by Dempsey Blythe of the aforesaid Hewel and bounded as follows, beginning at a Bursummon tree, thence by a line of marked trees to a corner tree in the branch, thence up the branch to a sweet gum thence by a line of marked trees to a corner tree thence by a line of marked trees to Baley Drakes corner to a red oak Ridley Drakes corner thence to another tree and thence to the beginning and the reservation and reversion, remainder and reversion, yearly and other rents issues and profits and every part and parcel thereof. To have and to hold said tract of land with the tenements hereditaments and all and singular the promises herein before mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold with every part and parcel thereof with every of their right members and appurtenances unto him the said Anthony M. Hewel his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Dempsey Blythe and his wife Jincey for themselves and their heirs the said tract of land with all and singular the promises and appurtenances herein before mentioned unto the said Anthony M. Hewel his heirs and assigns forever free from the claims of them the said Dempsey Blythe and Jincey his wife or either of them or their heirs or any person claiming under them. This Indenture made and entered into the 20th day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty four between Martha Bradshaw of the first part, Wilson Stephenson of the second part and James Clayton of the third part Claytons trustee all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia. Witnesseth that the said Martha Bradshaw for and in consideration of the sum of seventy five dollars which said sum is due from the said Martha Bradshaw to the said James Clayton by bond bearing date the 7th day of October 1829. as well as all other monies which may now be owing from the said Martha Bradshaw to the said James Clayton by means of sale, transfer of debts or paper whatever, as also for and in consideration of the dollar to her in hand paid by the said Wilson Stephenson, the receipt whereof the said Martha Bradshaw doth hereby acknowledge, hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents with hereby grant bargain and sell convey and make over unto the said Wilson Stephenson and his heirs forever all her right and interest in the abovementioned property to wit one cow of yearling, seventeen heads of hogs, two feather
